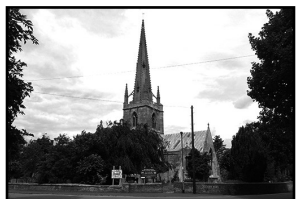

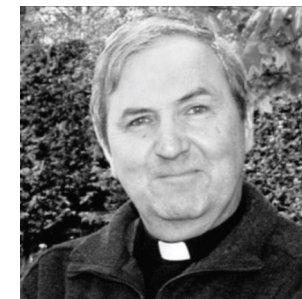

I recently remembered how I used to help out on the farm at harvest time. They had three combine harvesters working over a large area, and my role was to be one of a team who had to drive alongside the combine, synchronise my speed, and make sure that a couple of tonnes or so of wheat went in the trailer and were not spilled otherwise I'd be in trouble.



When my trailer was full, it was back to the nearest corn drier maybe 4 miles away, dump my load and get back into the field again. One day I was driving across the field with a load heading for the gate at something like 5 mile per hour when to my surprise I stopped with a jolt, as the front of the tractor rose up above me, and the trailer too behind me, and I was suspended over a very large hole in the ground. In modern terms I'd discovered a sinkhole! It took a while as they worked out how they were to unload the wheat from the trailer with shovels and tow my tractor out of the hole. They said that it was probably caused by an old drainage pipe that had been for years washing a large cavity out of the ground and I was the lucky person who discovered it!

Thinking of holes it made me think of a story told by Irish spiritual writer Brian Darcy, who found a series of pictures in a house for the homeless in Galway. They were a modern take on a parable that Jesus told – guess which? The first picture shows the man falling into a hole too deep for him to clamber out. Then a doctor came by and the man shouted, "Help me doctor!", The doctor wrote out a prescription, dropped it in the hole and walked on. A social worker came by, and the man called out to her. She found some money, dropped it into the hole and carried on. A priest came by. The man

Shouted, "Help me father!" The priest knelt down said a prayer and blessed him and carried on walking. Murphy came by next and the man cried out, "Help me, Murphy!" To the man's, surprise Murphy jumped into the hole beside him. The man said "Murphy, what have you done? Now you've ruined it- we're both stuck in the hole!" Murphy said, "Don't worry, I've been in this hole before and I know the way out! Follow me!"

The moral of the story is most of us find ourselves in a hole at some time and although some sympathise, few can or will help us and rescue us. Jesus does. However big the hole, he is prepared to be there beside us and will not leave us until we are out of the hole.

You never know when the next hole will appear in your life, as I once found out on a tractor in harvest time, but if you trust in Jesus, there's always a way out!

Plough Sunday In January we held a Plough Sunday Service at the Methodist Church, this was a first for us.

In the past Gosberton Clough Methodist Church always held one, but after they closed and some of their congregation came to join us we decided it was a good idea to continue the tradition of Plough Sunday.

Although the nature of farming is changing, Plough Sunday remains a great opportunity to celebrate farming and the work of farmers, and to pray for blessing on the land and the coming year's harvest.

Plough Sunday traditionally falls on the first Sunday of Epiphany, but behind this lies the older tradition of Plough Monday stretching back to Medieval times. This marked the resumption of agricultural work after the twelve days of Christmas. The plough was often kept in the church when not in use, so the farmers would gather at church to bring the plough out again. In days when work was scarce in winter, Plough Sunday was a time to give thanks for the growing potential of the land, to bless the plough, the land and the crops, to bless the ploughmen and women of the community, and to pray for a good harvest.

Very kindly farmers Sue Barker and her husband Vic asked their grandson Harry to bring along a tractor and plough for the service to be blessed. After the service we shared in a ploughman's lunch.

Real change rarely happens in big leaps. It tends to come from small, repeatable choices that fit into ordinary life. A short walk most days rather than a strict exercise regime. Stretching for a few minutes before bed. Pausing before reacting. These things don't feel dramatic, and they don't make good social media posts, but they are far more likely to last.

This is where yoga, in its simplest form, comes into the picture. Yoga isn't about flexibility or impressive poses, despite how it's often portrayed. At its core, it's about awareness. Noticing the breath. Paying attention to how the body feels. Choosing, even briefly, to be present rather than rushing on autopilot.

That kind of attention doesn't require special clothing, equipment, or an hour of spare time. It can be practised anywhere. Noticing your feet on the floor while making a cup of tea. Taking a slower breath before answering the phone. Letting yourself arrive fully before moving on to the next thing. These moments are small, but they add up over time.

Unlike resolutions, small practices don't demand perfection. Missing a day doesn't mean starting again from scratch. You simply return when you remember. This is how change tends to happen in real life. Gradually. Almost unnoticed.

Those months after January then, can be a good place to begin. It offers a chance to reset expectations and choose something more realistic and kind. Not a complete overhaul, but a gentle shift. Less about fixing ourselves, and more about listening.

So if this year hasn't unfolded quite as planned, that's not a failure. It may simply be an invitation to take a different approach. One small step at a time. Taken often enough, those steps tend to lead us exactly where we need to be.

Quiet progress still counts.

Namaste

Thank you for the opportunity to write this here. I teach yoga locally, but I should say from the outset that this isn't a platform to promote my classes. There are other teachers in the area, and they're almost certainly more flexible than me. So, with that out of the way, let's start with something that tends to crop up around this time of year.

After the Resolution Dust Has Settled

By the time this magazine lands, January will already be behind us as we surge into spring. For some, it may have begun with good intentions and optimism. For others, it might have felt long, dark and slightly exhausting. Either way, February often arrives quietly, without much ceremony and that may be no bad thing.

The start of a new year has a habit of encouraging bold promises. We resolve to change ourselves, improve our habits, fix what we think is broken. Usually these resolutions revolve around health: more exercise, eating better and cutting something out. They are often well meant, but they can ask a lot, very quickly.

What tends to get overlooked is how life actually works. Work resumes. The weather is uninviting. Energy levels dip. Motivation, which felt plentiful in January, proves to be unreliable. When things don't go to plan, many people assume they've failed and quietly give up. But perhaps the problem isn't a lack of willpower. Perhaps it's the scale of the promises we make.

Gosberton & District Local History Society was founded in 2014. Its aim is to bring together people with an interest in the history of Gosberton, Gosberton Risegate, Gosberton Clough and the surrounding area, to share local history information and stories. For the weekly shop, you had the choice of six grocery stores. Some also served as drapers, providing clothing, including footwear and headwear. For bread and pastries, there were three bakeries. Meat and fish were supplied by three butchers' shops. There were two blacksmiths, to shoe horses and repair or replace your farm equipment. Two wheelwright and carpenters businesses could fix or replace your wagons, and undertake other carpentry requirements. There was a choice of seven public houses!
