

A new life for a new age?

When you hear talk about spiritual things or spirituality, what does it I mean to you? Some think of ghosts and strange happenings. Television series dote on such things, and some associate it with magic, which is something different. Schools are called to be concerned with the spiritual as well as mental and physical development of young people. Not easy today. Some seem to think that all happened years ago, and it might have been true then, but it doesn't happen nowadays. The truth is however many testimonies witness to such things happening often today.

I'm a trustee of a charity which supports the work of spiritual directors, who are Christian men and women, who are qualified in the spiritual teaching and learning of generations and freely give their help and advice to others. This work has grown significantly, perhaps due to the pressures of this chaotic world, and many are benefiting from it from all walks of life, including ordinary folk who might tell you how empowering, inspirational and helpful it can be. Many might say they have taken control of their lives for the first time and seen life itself in a more complete and understandable way

HELP WANTED!

As you may remember, in May 2019 a large amount of lead was stolen from Gosberton Church roof and a lot of damage done by the thieves. Thanks to the generosity of so many people, we were able to repair the damage to the church, replace the roof and also install a high-tech intruder alarm which covers the whole of the church roof.

The company who maintain and monitor the alarm need 2 people on their records who can be contacted if the alarm is activated or if there is a fault. I am the main point of contact for them, but need someone else to volunteer to cover for me when I am away from home or on holiday.

The alarm is very easy to use and (touch wood!) has only been activated by a tall weed growing in front of one of the cameras and a large spider making a web. So this should not be an onerous task. I will show you how the alarm works and give you a key to the church.

The alarm company stipulate that you should be able to get to the church within 15 minutes of their phone call. This would include getting out of bed and dressing if the call comes in the middle of the night (I've never been phoned in the night!). Please phone me if you would like to help.

GOSBERTON LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

Notes from the meeting held on Monday 13th February. Approximately 73 people attended the meeting.

lan Walters opened the meeting by welcoming everyone and giving a brief description of what was to happen. There was no specific guest speaker and there would be plenty of time to have a look through the selection of photos from the 1970s and 1980s etc which showed people attending many events in and around the village. He said that the next meetings would be on May 15th, August 14th and November 13th. Copies of the Past Times Magazine could be obtained in paper form on payment of £2. The donation for attending this evening remained at £1. Approximately £450 was held in the society's bank account.

Stuart Henderson spoke of the latest copy of the Gosberton Past Times. He also talked of the timeline project initiated by Geoff Taylor of South Holland Heritage and that work was being done on this to identify events, people and dates relevant to the community over the past few hundred years.

Geoff Taylor then described the South Holland Heritage Project and showed an example of the time line being put together online for the community, and talked of a major project using drone technology to create 3D computer images of historic churches etc... and showed an example based on another church. Quadring church project was one of the first to be done and they are shortly to start work at Gosberton.

Ian mentioned Geoff's work with Chain Bridge Forge in Spalding which was a working historic forge open to the community on special days, hosting school parties and other visitors, and carrying out manufacturing work for local firms and individuals.

A number of films of historic events were then shown. Firstly, of the 1947 floods in South Holland. Next a film of the 1953 coastal floods roughly 70 years ago as now. Then a colour film of celebrations for the late Queen's coronation in 1953. The last film shown was of the


