

It's been nagging me for years now, and particularly as I constantly see more proof as I get older that so much of life is about wanting instant fulfilment or instant profits Young children perhaps can be forgiven for their impatience. We can imagine a young



child exclaiming I want it now! But it's not difficult to see that lots of things used to be made years ago to last for ever, or at least a long time whereas now we are decades into the dispose of and replace era. I still have some of my grandfather's garden tools. I only recently had to dispose of his old stepladder that from the looks of it, it could have belonged to his granddad before him! Today we see wind farms and solar panels everywhere which will only have a short lifespan and are high maintenance and cost and are detrimental to wildlife, because we failed to invest in long life and in the long term much cheaper power solutions.

We buy all sorts of stuff which we know will only have a short lifespan then go in landfill or at best recycling. Younger people including politicians are changing things in a way that we older folk (OK I'm still young, only 74 next birthday!) know will not turn out for the longer term good. Am I a grumpy old man now? I don't think I'm grumpy, but I certainly can see how the world now is into short term profits and thrills rather than investing in good things which last, and which future generations can enjoy. Remember how many well-known British companies were founded by families who had a duty of Christian care for their employees and set up all sorts of housing schemes and charities. These were enjoyed for generations. Now we hear of senior

executives giving themselves ultra fat salaries and pensions, and assuming they can retire while the going's still good.

Many of the local families in our villages showed their care for other people in their lifetimes. Cecil Robinson of Quadring and his family were very generous to their workers and the local community. They improved St. Margaret's Church and gave the village a splendid new hall, they gave gifts to local children and supported people in need. Local farming families such as the Casswell's and Proctors and others, and the Welby Everard family invested in many things which have blessed the community ever since.

That's one of the great attributes of our Christian culture. Christians don't believe that life ends when our present bodies breath their last but accept the bountiful evidence in the Bible and elsewhere that this present life is just a tiny part of our eternal life to come. So, the Easter season should be a time to really celebrate the fact that has been as proven as any fact can be, time and again, that Jesus really did come to earth, and that God in human form surrendered to the cruelty of the cross, knowing that he would rise again. British history, and indeed the history of the world shows how it was people of faith who have always done far more good for the people in their own day and for the future generations to come than any other people of any faith or none have ever done. So, keep believing, keep praying, and make time on more Sundays to go and worship with others and give thanks for those who have always had the longer-term view!



HOW TO MAKE REALLY GOOD SCONES

This recipe makes 10 big scones. Preheat oven to 185C (fan) or 200C non fan

Ingredients:

500g plain flour 80g castor sugar 80g salted butter 1.5 teaspoons bicarbonate of soda 2 teaspoons cream of tartar 60g sultanas (optional) 250-275 ml of milk

Method:

- Measure out flour, sugar, bicarb & cream of tartar into a bowl and add the butter.
- Rub the butter into the flour mixture. (I use a food processor to whizz the butter and dry ingredients together. Then I tip it all into a big bowl).
- Add the sultanas and mix in
- Add 250ml of the milk to start with, add a bit more if the mixture is too dry.
- Lightly knead the mixture and turn out onto a floured surface.
- Roll out to about 1.5cm / 3/4" thick and cut out rounds of scones. Do not roll them out too thin!!
- Put the scones on a lightly floured baking tray, brush with milk.
- Bake for 14 minutes until golden brown and the bottoms are also golden brown.

All ovens vary so you may have to tweak the length of time the scones cook for. Reduce cooking time if you are making small scones.

Quarterly Newsletter

Members of Gosberton & District Local History Society receive a free digital copy of the Society's quarterly newsletter, '**Gosberton's Past Times**.' Each issue is jam-packed with stories, news and photographs about the history of the people, places and events of Gosberton, Risegate, Clough and surrounding hamlets. Printed copies are available for £1.

Quadring Baptist Church and possibly the smallest graveyard in England.

In times long past a farming family named Smith built a Baptist Chapel just off Fen Road (now Town Drove). It was 30 ft by 16 ft and was opened in 1814 by Francis Smith the head of the family and was called the Salem Baptist Chapel.

Within the Chapel was a baptistery which took the form of a small 2foot-deep pool which was used to baptise adults. The Chapel has long since gone but parts of the graveyard which was next to the Chapel still remain. There were 10 graves within the cemetery, 8 are marked and two unmarked. These two being the last ones to be interred. When last member of the family, Ernest Smith, sold the farm to the Crosbys, they maintained the graveyard for a number of years until the days of Broadgate builders. Now the whole area has changed beyond recognition.
